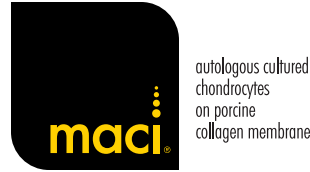

Program Terms and Conditions

The MACI MyCartilageCare Assist CoPay Program ("MCC Assist CoPay Program" or "the Program") helps eligible patients with commercial/private insurance who have been prescribed MACI for an FDA-approved indication and may need assistance with their out-of-pocket costs for MACI (implant only). Eligibility requirements, program rules, and restrictions apply. Enrollment in MyCartilageCare and certification of eligibility and compliance with program rules is required to participate in the Program. The assistance provided through the MCC Assist CoPay Program is not conditioned on any past, present, or future use or purchases.

Patients who meet all eligibility criteria and are enrolled in the MCC Assist CoPay Program may pay as little as \$1000 for MACI. The maximum benefit available to patients under the Program is \$5000 per patient. Patients are responsible for any costs associated with MACI that exceed the maximum benefit. The total out of pocket cost is dependent on the patient's individual health insurance plan.

The Program provides assistance with the out-of-pocket cost of the MACI implant only. The Program does not cover the costs of any other healthcare provider charges, including procedure charges, office visit fees, or any other product or treatment related costs.

This Program is not health insurance and may not be combined with any other program, discount, coupon, or offer for MACI, or where insurance is paying the entire cost of MACI. The Program offer is limited to one (1) use per person and is not transferable.

The MCC Assist CoPay Program is not valid outside the U.S. or where prohibited by law, taxed, or otherwise restricted.

Verification of patient insurance benefits is required to confirm that a patient meets eligibility requirements for participation in the MCC Assist CoPay Program.

The offer expires December 31, 2024. Vericel reserves the right to modify, amend, suspend, or terminate this program without notice and for any reason.

Eligibility Requirements

You may be eligible to participate in the MCC Assist CoPay Program if you meet all eligibility requirements below:

- You are a citizen or legal resident of the United States or a U.S. territory.
- You are being treated by a U.S. licensed healthcare professional.
- You are at least 18 years of age.
- You are undergoing a MACI procedure that is "on-label" (for an FDA-approved indication) as set forth in the Prescribing Information of the MACI label.
- You have completed and signed the Cell Storage and HIPAA Authorization Consent form.
- You are enrolled in MyCartilageCare and have completed the Patient Certification.
- You have commercial/private insurance and your out of pocket responsibility for the MACI implant (not including the procedure) exceeds \$1000.
- You are not enrolled in, and claims are not eligible to be reimbursed, in whole or in part, by any government program including, but not limited to, Medicare, Medicaid, Medigap, Tricare, Veterans Affairs, or any other federal or state health insurance program.
- You will not seek reimbursement or compensation, in whole or in part, from any government health insurance program.

You are responsible for complying with any applicable limitations or requirements of your health insurance plan related to the use of the MCC Assist CoPay Program. You further understand that you are responsible for reporting receipt of out-of-pocket assistance to any insurer, health plan, or other third party who pays for or reimburses any part of your MACI implant costs using the Program, as may be required.

Indication

MACI® (autologous cultured chondrocytes on porcine collagen membrane) is made up of your own (autologous) cells that are expanded and placed onto a film that is implanted into the area of the cartilage damage and absorbed back into your own tissue.

MACI is used for the repair of symptomatic cartilage damage of the adult knee.

The amount of MACI applied depends on the size of the cartilage damage. The MACI film is trimmed by your surgeon to match the size and shape of the damage, to ensure the damaged area is completely covered.

Limitations of Use

It is not known whether MACI is effective in joints other than the knee.

It is not known whether MACI is safe or effective in patients over the age of 55 years.

Important Safety Information

MACI should not be used if you:

- are allergic to antibiotics such as gentamicin, or materials that come from cow, pig, or ox;
- have severe osteoarthritis of the knee, other severe inflammatory conditions, infections or inflammation in the bone joint and other surrounding tissue, or blood clotting conditions;
- have had knee surgery in the past 6 months, not including surgery for obtaining a cartilage biopsy or a surgical procedure to prepare your knee for a MACI implant;
- or cannot follow a doctor-prescribed rehabilitation program after your surgery

Consult your doctor if you have cancer in the area of the cartilage biopsy or implant as the safety of MACI is not known in those cases.

Conditions that existed before your surgery, including meniscus tears, joint or ligament instability, or alignment problems should be evaluated and treated before or at the same time as the MACI implant.

MACI is not recommended if you are pregnant.

MACI has not been studied in patients younger than 18 or over 55 years of age.

Common side effects include joint pain, tendonitis, back pain, joint swelling, and joint effusion.

More serious side effects include joint pain, cartilage or meniscus injury, treatment failure, and osteoarthritis.
